

Laurel "Sissy" Phillips Austin Memorial Scholarship

\$1,000 per year for up to 4 years

Sissy Austin was committed to the Jacksonville community her entire lifetime. She graduated from JHS as valedictorian, graduated from the University of Oklahoma before working as an mathmatical engineer for NASA before becoming legendary in the banking industry where she worked over 50 years helping build the Austin Bank organization. Through her life she served numerous positions of leadership in Jacksonville and the surrounding communities and encouraged others to do so. Sissy was also a founder of the Jacksonville Education Foundation. Sissy valued hard work, initiative, and self-improvement and would expect the same from the recipient of a scholarship in her name.

This scholarship is given in her memory by her family who asks when and if possible the recipient of this award "pass it on" in some way later in life, which means to contribute to the Laurel "Sissy" Austin fund after entering the work force to help provide this opportunity to others.

To qualify for this scholarship, a student must exude the values of hard work, initiative, and self-improvement. Preference will be given to a student pursuing a STEM based area of study. To qualify for semester disbursements, a 3.0 GPA must be maintained and grades sent to JEF at the end of each semester.

If chosen as a recipient of this scholarship, I understand that in order to accept this award, I must attend an accredited college in the United States approved by the Jacksonville Education Foundation, submit a letter from that college verifying my enrollment, and I understand that all funds for this scholarship will be made directly to the college to offset any tuition, books, or other fees incurred. The funds will be paid by semester at \$500 per semester for 4 years subject to qualifying criteria.
